

Note: in this case the program and the icons are in the same directory (**main**). Otherwise you got to specify the path (e.g.: `i cons\` this directory functions like a library of icons) where the icons are, or else the calculator must be ready on the directory before you start any program (or specify in the code program like in the example 2).





Note: The icons of Ti-89 are almost the same of the Ti-92 (in most cases they're the same; in fact they use the same dimensions, occupy the same memory space and only have a different extension); use 89IVIEW+ to view the icons or to create icons in Windows (it's easy), you can find 89IVIEW+ and 92iview in the Windows Graphics Utilities in the address <http://www.ticalc.org/pub/win/graphics/> (*Tip:* to make icons (to use in Toolbar) in 89IVIEW+ : **File->New With: 16 Height: 16** ; (If you are having troubles in making run 89IVIEW+, install first 92iview and then run 89IVIEW+ with no problems). Note: If you want to use testpics.89p all icons must be in calculator directory `icons\`
